Orange County Library System Kicks Off 100 Year Celebration





ORLANDO - In 2023, Orange County Library System turns 100 years old. To celebrate, the library will hold a 100 Year ORANGE COUNTY Celebration, with events taking place at library LIBRARY SYSTEM branches all year long, beginning with a kickoff branches all year long, beginning with a kickoff at the Orlando Public Library on January 7. The kickoff will feature a rededication of the library to the community, live music and a virtual reality tour of the original Albertson Public Library, as well as storytimes, refreshments and activities throughout the day.

Orange County Library System traces its roots to the donation of more than 12,000 books from the collection of Captain Charles Albertson, a retired police inspector from New York who spent winters in Orlando. Albertson contributed his book collection to the city on the condition

provided by the Sorosis of Orlando Women's Club and the City of Orlando.

On November 8, 1923, the Albertson Public Library, located at the corner of Central Boulevard and Rosalind Avenue, opened its doors for the first time. That single library, with its collection of approximately 20,000 books, evolved to eventually become today's Orange County Library System. The library is now made up of 15 locations, with new branches planned for Lake Nona and Horizon West. It circulates more than 3 million items per year.

The public is invited to join the library in its 100 Year Celebration. Every location will host events throughout the year, and the library is focused on several special events that will bring that a permanent library be built to house it, and nationally known speakers to Orlando, including

"Hey, look at all of the happy givers," said Veneita Knight, one of the volunteers/engagers at the recent event. She recorded several videos of the event and posted them on Facebook.

The mission of the foundation is accomplished by a team - founder, board members and members also known as engagers who donate \$10.47 each month to make the year-round giving happen. It's a huge network of people from 18 states within in the United States.

"We are just regular people, not funded by big corporations but by people who care about making the world better...people who believe in a kinder, gentler world," said Founder Joe Ferrer, in a recent interview. "We believe there's a place for this type of giving. People are watching and want to be a part.'

He said sometimes people don't give to causes because they believe

A group of about 50 volunteers, on what they have is not enough, but "we believe in micro-philanthropy in which people give small amounts of money (\$1-\$25) rather than larger

amounts to support a cause or person." He started the foundation with that belief and a couple of dozen years of experience as a financial advisor. "Being in the top 5% of financial advisors worldwide, people would often ask the key to my success, and I would tell them - giving. When I started giving faithfully, is when my

career took off." The vision, over the years, got bigger and bigger and now the vision is to become global, Ferrer said.

"We believe in a world where everyone can be a giver by participating in organized microphilanthropy thereby creating a happier, more generous, kind and united society.'

Ferrer, born in New York but raised in Seminole County (Lake Howell High School graduate), is a former Notre Dame football player who also played football professionally in Canada. He is joined on his board by: Braxton Skinner, Stephanie Skinner, Debi Gold; Minerva Ferrer, Matthew

Chase and Paula Keyes.

His passion about giving oozed out during the interview, talking about the process in taking on events like the one in the Winter Springs neighborhood (which is typical for the organization four to five times per year) and the countless stories he gets from people who either gave something or received something.

One mother at the neighborhood "surprise" said she had wanted to get her daughter a Play-Doh set for her birthday several weeks ago. "On that day she just happened to get the biggest Play-Doh set out there!" Recently, Ferrer and a small group of engagers went to a restaurant and decided to give \$500 a piece to the dishwasher, the hostess and the shortest waitress working at the time.

"We're doubling down on kindness, making kindness cool - with money behind it."

In the past three years, the team has raised \$70,000, starting from nothing, Ferrer said.
